GoviEx Uranium announces permit extensions for its uranium tenements in Niger

NIAMEY, NIGER – Govind Friedland, founder and Chief Executive Officer of GoviEx Uranium, announced today that Niger’s Ministry of Mines and Energy has formally extended the company’s exploration permits on its uranium discovery tenements for a period of 27 months.

“GoviEx will use the additional time to drill test more than 20 high-priority targets and complete feasibility studies – activities that have significant potential to generate considerable value for the company,” Mr Friedland said.

The decree granting the extensions was signed and became effective on May 28th and notice of the extensions was published in Niger’s Official Gazette on September 3rd, in accordance with requirements of the Nigerien Mining Code.

The extensions, which will be in force until September 2012, cover the GoviEx Uranium tenements contained within the Anou Mellé and Madouela I-IV properties in Niger’s principal uranium-producing district.

GoviEx Uranium Inc. is a private company focused on the exploration and development of its tenements in Niger.
